RFQ 8 of 2025: PROVISION OF PODCAST LIVESTREAMING SERVICES FOR THE NMM FOR A PERIOD OF 3 YEARS

1. BACKGROUND

The Nelson Mandela Museum Podcast aims to deepen public understanding of Nelson Mandela's legacy and the ongoing work of the Nelson Mandela Museum. The podcast will feature a series of episodes that explore various facets of Nelson Mandela's life, his contributions to the fight against apartheid, and the role of the Nelson Mandela Museum in preserving and sharing his legacy. Each episode will include interviews with historians, museum curators, and individuals who were close to Mandela, as well as personal stories from those who have been inspired by his life and work.

2. OBJECTIVE

- **Educate and Inform:** Provide listeners with in-depth knowledge about Nelson Mandela's life, the historical context of his struggle, and the significance of his legacy.
- **Engage and Inspire:** Share compelling stories and insights that engage a global audience and inspire action in line with Mandela's values of justice and equality.
- **Expand Reach:** Use the podcast as a tool to reach new audiences and drive interest in visiting the Nelson Mandela Museum, thereby increasing both virtual and physical engagement with our exhibits.

3. FORMAT AND CONTENT

Each episode will be approximately one hour in length. Topics will include Mandela's early life, his role in the anti-apartheid movement, personal anecdotes from people who knew him, and behind-the-scenes insights into the museum's exhibitions and educational programs. It will also cover the work of the museum and its link sites and programmes that are run by the museum that empower and instil knowledge to different audiences. The podcast's episode will feature a diverse range of

guests, including historians, museum staff, and individuals who have a personal connection to Mandela's story. The podcast will be available on major platforms such as Apple Podcasts, Spotify, and Google Podcasts. It will also leverage the museum's social media channels and website to promote each episode and engage with listeners.

- 7.1 The successful service provider will be required to supply podcast livestreaming services for the museum fortnightly.
- 7.2 The successful service provider will be required to provide podcast services on the NMM's Facebook Page.
- 7.3 The successful service provider must be ready to deliver the services at short notice.
- 7.4 Package the recording of the podcast programme for reporting, accounting purposes and re-use.
- 7.6 The successful bidder must produce quality work as per requirements in the Scope of Work.
